





CLASS OF 2025 APPLICATION

Tuition & Program

CommitmentTuition for the **2025** Program will \$1,500.00 plus a application fee and may be paid by the individual or the sponsoring institution. Tuition is due prior to Orientation. A limited number of partial scholarships will be available to individuals who might otherwise be unable to participate.

Participation

In order to accomplish the objectives of the program, the full participation of each class member is necessary. Participation includes:

Orientation - Thursday, September 19, 2024 beginning at 9am through Friday, September 20, 2024 ending at 5pm. Full attendance is mandatory.

State Government Day - Tuesday, March 4, 2025 at 8am through Wednesday, March 5, 2025 at 6pm in Annapolis, MD. Full attendance is mandatory.

Equivalent of one full day per month. Class normally meets the second Wednesday of each month; please see schedule on this page. Participants will be permitted to miss one full session or the equivalent of one full session, not including Orientation and State Government Day.

Members of the class will be required to participate in a Class Project, which challenges the group to consider the collective experiences throughout the program using leadership and team skills. More information will be provided throughout the program.

Application & Selection Process

Leadership Allegany is an open program and applications are encouraged from all segments of the community (must be 21 or older). Participants will be selected from a diverse mix of the local population.

Participants will be chosen by a Selection Committee; class size is limited.

All applications will be handled in the strictest confidence. Special emphasis should be given to any question you feel will significantly add to the Committee's knowledge of your qualifications.

Participants in the Leadership Allegany Class of 2025 will be selected from those individuals who have submitted a **completed** Application Form by June 26, 2024. To assist the Selection Committee, we request the forms be typed or printed legibly.
